

## Sarah Baker Memorial Fund: 2024 call for applications

*A gift was made to the Yellowstone to Yukon Conservation Initiative (Y2Y) in memory of Sarah Jocelyn Baker by the members of her extended family. Sarah was born in Calgary in 1951 and died in Ottawa in 2006. Sarah was positive, full of humour, loyal, and inspired. She had a genius for getting the right answer to the bottom line. She loved people, animals and birds, and growing things. Hers was the sort of vision that Y2Y embraces.*

### Summary:

Y2Y is pleased to announce funding for early-career researchers at postsecondary institutions in Canada and the United States to study applied conservation-related issues that help advance Y2Y's mission and vision. Up to \$5,000.00 is available for the 2024-25 funding cycle, awarded in mid-December 2024. Y2Y may, at its discretion, split the award among two or more recipients.

### Criteria:

- Current graduate student or postdoctoral fellow at a post-secondary institution in Canada or the United States, studying resource management, environmental studies, wildlife biology, human dimensions or similar fields.
- Research project will help to advance Y2Y's conservation vision and create tangible conservation outcomes in the Yellowstone-to-Yukon region. There must be a practical, applied component to the research (i.e., indicate the partnerships or processes through which scientific results will be incorporated into policy changes and/or on-the-ground conservation benefits). While the applicant does not need to be the person carrying out such implementation – seeing results through to conservation, practice, policy, etc. may be beyond the scope of your project – it is important to know what steps are involved, by whom, and approximately when.
- The awardee will enter into a written agreement with Y2Y and submit reports on progress toward project goals on a schedule as set by Y2Y. A final report presenting the completed work and a thank you letter to the donor will be submitted by the agreed upon deadline(s).

### Benefits for recipient:

- Financial support for an education-related project and experience
- Acquire knowledge and experience through an experiential-learning project with Y2Y, including opportunity to network with Y2Y staff and partners as opportunities arise
- Communications support and tools from Y2Y staff (e.g., newsletter, online articles, advice)

2. **Goals & objectives:** What are the overall goal(s) and objective(s) of this project?
3. **Collaboration:** Who else (individuals and/or groups) is working on this project or in a related conservation or management program? How will you collaborate with them (be specific)?
4. **Methods:** Summarize your research methodology (field, analysis, and/or lab work). Avoid jargon.
5. **Implementation:** How will your results be used to make positive changes to conservation practice and/or policy? How does this help to advance the broader Y2Y vision and mission?
6. **Personal statement:** Describe your experience in conservation or related activities (e.g., community, communication, leadership, policy, diversity-equity-inclusion). What motivates you to do this work?
