1. LANDSCAPE PROTECTION

Protect 30% of the Yellowstone to Yukon region by 2030

2. LANDSCAPE CONNECTIVITY

Secure 17,000 acres of private lands for wildlife movement corridors and advance wildlife crossings across the 4 busiest roads in the region by 2030.

3. COMMUNITIES AND CONSERVATION

By 2030, human-wildlife coexistence is common practice, and outdoor recreation is managed to protect wildlife, encouraging more nature-focused communities in areas of Y2Y.

Although the Y2Y region is the most intact large mountain regions in the world, it is the least protected. Y2Y is collaborating with 8 First Nations communities in Canada whose conservation goals align with Y2Y's. Together we aim to save Canada's most critical habitat.

A gift from you would support collaborative efforts leading to the protection in at least two communities, totaling 20 million acres of land.

To maintain the rich and iconic biodiversity of this region, wildlife need to be able to move through the landscape for food, mates and habitat. Providing a safe passage for wildlife across busy roads and across private lands gives wide-ranging species the room they need to roam.

With your support, we will secure at least 6 new strategic private land parcels, and progress more than 40 wildlife crossings from design to construction in both the U.S. and Canada.

Our 'Communities' team works with Indigenous and government leaders, businesses, non-profits, and community champions to ensure people live, work and play in a way that supports rural living and thriving wildlife populations. We help people and wildlife live together.
